
MISSION

The ASF offers adaptive skiing and snowboarding lessons for children and adults with cognitive and physical disabilities and chronic illnesses. Students can choose either half or full-day lessons that take place at the Windham Mountain Club.

The ASF provides training for skiers and snowboarders who already have experience and want to develop their skills for recreational and competitive racing.

Big SNOW is the ideal learning environment for folks that are new to adaptive skiing and snowboarding. The ASF offers two-hour lessons at the indoor skiing facility in the American Dream Mall throughout the summer.

The ASF offers U.S. Veterans with disabilities opportunities to participate in summer and winter adaptive sports programs alongside their peers.

The ASF offers a variety of summer sports opportunities for individuals with cognitive disabilities including skateboarding, paddling, biking, hiking, and team sports. These activities take place in Windham and the surrounding area.

For those who cannot physically join us in Windham, the ASF offers a virtual adaptive physical fitness program via Zoom.

ASF HONORED AS ADAPTIVE KEKOA CLASS JOINS USASA NATIONALS

A Milestone in Inclusion

This year, the Adaptive Sports Foundation received national recognition from the United States of America Snowboard and Freeski Association (USASA) for its pioneering role in creating the **Adaptive Kekoa Class**, now officially integrated into USASA's national competition program.

What started 15 years ago with a single question—"Can adaptive athletes compete?"—has grown into a unified platform where neurodiverse and adaptive athletes thrive alongside their peers.

Celebrating Progress

The award was presented at the **2025 USASA National Championships** and accepted by original Kekoa athletes **Zach Elder**, **Charlie Kleiman**, and ASF Head Snowboard Coach **Frank Cabrera**.

The Hawaiian phrase, *Pupukahi i Holomua*, meaning *Unite in Order to Progress*, truly captures the heart of this historic moment. As ASF Executive Director John lannelli put it, "This is the culmination of years of effort by athletes, coaches, families, and visionaries who believed that adaptive athletes belong on the national stage."
