She recently co-produced her first feature entitled "Misirlou" and is in pre-production on her second feature "Brother, Stranger", which is anticipated to shoot this Spring in the Catskills.

Artist Contributors

RICHARD ALIBERTI is a multi-media Artist from the Boston area. He studied at the School of the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston and the Massachusetts College of Art. Aliberti has been creating and exhibiting his work throughout the US and abroad; his work is in many private collections.

To date, Aliberti has completed several large-scale public monuments including the thirteen-foot tall bronze and granite sculpture of Dante Alighieri which graces the entrance to The Alighieri Society in Cambridge, MA. Other major works include a life-size bronze sculpture of John F. Kennedy Jr. located at the JFK Museum, Hyannis, MA, a bronze bust of Guglielmo Marconi and two large-scale bronze reliefs at the Sacred Heart and St. Leonard Churches, both located in the North End of Boston.

Although Richard asserts that “his art is primarily concerned with intuitive beauty and exists to provide escape from thought,” his work is often thought-provoking.

EMIL ALZAMORA was born in Lima, Peru 1975, and raised in Boca Grande, Florida. He later attended Florida State University where he graduated Magna cum Laude in earning a B.F.A. Alzamora started his sculpting career in the Hudson Valley working with Polich Art Works. Since leaving Polich in early 2001, he has produced his work full-time and shown regularly throughout the United States and Europe. He currently lives and works in Beacon, NY.

When speaking about his work, Emil says: “The human form is a constant within my work. I am interested in exploring what it means to inhabit one, often exaggerating or distorting different aspects of the form to reveal an emotional or physical situation, or to tell a story about a predicament or an occurrence. Limitation and potential are as human as the flesh, yet hardly as tangible. In my works, I strive to make visible this interaction.”

KIM DO earned a B.F.A. degree from SUNY Purchase and a M.F.A. from the University of Pennsylvania. Currently, he teaches at the Horace Mann School in New York City, one of the finest and most renowned prep schools in the U.S.

Do combines technique with a great respect for the natural world. Just two hundred feet from the porch of his Catskill Mountain home, the Westkill Creek meets the Schoharie Creek. Kim affirms, "The landscape evokes childhood memories of growing up near the East River in New York City...as well as feelings about my family and my living along these ever-moving bodies of water."

DEBORAH DORSEY studied art at the Academie de la Grande Chaumiere in Paris, the National Academy School of Fine Arts, the Art Institute of Chicago, Harvard University, and holds two Master's degrees from Columbia University. She has taught painting in New York City, at Long Island University, the State University of New York, and the Craft Students League of New York. In addition, she has been an art critic for "Art News" and "Art World". She has won numerous awards including a Fulbright Scholarship and a First Prize at the National Arts Club in New York City.

MARA LEHMANN moved to upstate New York after residing in New Jersey for over thirty years. Ms. Lehmann has experience as a textile designer, graphic design artist, and art instructor. In addition, she taught oil painting at an Adult Education Center and ran arts programs for several youth groups, day camps, and after school programs.

Mara's travels throughout the country provided inspiring subject matter for her paintings. In a traditional, representational style, Mara captures the beauty and serenity of the Catskills, using subdued colors and forceful tones mixed with shifting lights and shadows.

Mara contends: "To be in the country among the trees, rolling hills, blue sky and earth. To walk along a wooded path and visually drink in all the surrounds me. To take a deep breath and inhale the crisp clean air. To exhale amid the beauty of nature before me... This has always been my endeavor as well as my source of inspiration."

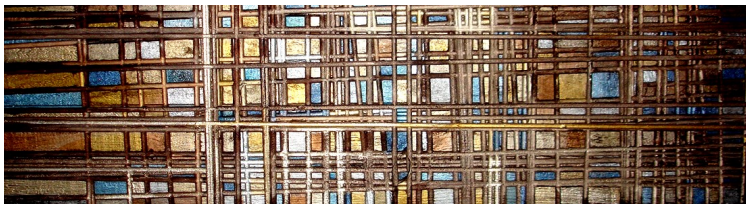
